Plane girl 'killed by fire truck'

COPS are probing claims one of the two victims in the San Francisco plane crash may have been killed by a FIRE ENGINE. Detectives believe Ye Mengyuan, 16, may have escaped from the burning jet — only to be run over by a rescue vehicle. San Fran police yesterday confirmed its hit-and-run unit is investigating. Fire Chief Joanne Hayes-White said: "One of our fire apparatus may have come into contact with one of our victims." Schoolgirl Ye and classmate Wang Linjia, 16, of Zhejiang, eastern China, both died on Saturday. The other 305 people on the Asiana Airlines Boeing 777 flight from Seoul, South Korea, survived after it crashed short of the runway.

£6.3m for 'TV stand'

THIS chest bought for £100 and used as a TV stand and drinks cabinet has sold for £6.3million after it was revealed as a long-lost Japanese antique from 1640. It was spotted by a house contents valuer when the daughter of the late owner — a London engineer who moved to France — got a sherry from "Daddy's bar". It was bought by Amsterdam's National Museum. Auctioneer Aymeric Rouillac, pictured with the box in Tours, France, said yesterday: "The family can't believe it."

Fugitive nicked watching Lions

A HENCHMAN of Britain's biggest drugs baron has been arrested — as he sat down to watch a Lions rugby match.

Fugitive Kevin Hanley was a close pal of gang boss Brian Wright — jailed for 30 years for his £1billion cocaine smuggling racket.

Hanley, 50, was collared in packed Irish bar Molly Malone's in Greek capital Athens as he prepared to see the British and Irish Lions take on Australia.

He is wanted by police over the seizure of more than £10million of cannabis, cocaine and amphetamines — plus £2million cash in Fulham, South West London, last year. Hanley — picked up in a joint operation between the UK's Serious Organised Crime Agency and Greek cops — faces extradition back to the UK. He was in the resort of Glyfada with Greek girlfriend Chryssi Minadaki, 44 — who was also held.

Both will be quizzed on suspicion of intending to supply drugs and money.
